Roordink believes work is about people and ideas.

Technology has created a modern economy, driven by empowered individuals. This informs the way we develop inspiring workspaces – with a love for design, and where our energetic team takes care of all the details so you can focus on developing your next big idea.

What really makes Spaces unique though is its energetic community of business nomads, freelancers, entrepreneurs, international workers, project teams, and both startups and well-established companies – basically a bunch of interesting people who love what they do.

How does it work?

We offer a service where you pay for what you use. You can hire an office or a meeting room for a day and you just pay for that. And if you decided to upscale, you can do that too.





Our options are pay by day, month, year – whatever is suitable to you. Price varies depending on what you decide to take up.

Members enjoy 24-hour worldwide access to all Spaces' business clubs. Lockers are available, so you can safely tuck away your jacket and gym bag before finding the day's workspace at a quiet table or at the centre of the action in our social heart. If you just want a little more space to stretch out, book a meeting room for a few hours or the whole day.

Wondering how to field your phone calls while working in such a public area? We've thought of that too – just duck into a phone booth to keep the content of your calls private and avoid disturbing others.

Prefer your own desk in a shared space? Choose a dedicated desk where you can work with the devotion and concentration your projects require.

Spaces has been popping up across Joburg and throughout SA. Is there a big enough market for this in SA?

Amid South Africa's current local and global economic and political climates, the uncertainty has seen the South African flexible workspace market proving that the workspace-as-a-service industry thrives in times of uncertainty. A lack of excessive funds and a booming entrepreneurial community has encouraged businesses to look for flexibility, and the serviced office model offers the most attractive and appropriate solution to an unstable economy.

South Africa has a booming entrepreneurial spirit. The idea behind co-working is to provide a conducive space for businesses and entrepreneurs to conduct business, without paying the traditional office space amount.

A place where entrepreneurs could have the space to spread their wings and grow their business. A co-working space is quite different from a mere shared office space because it has the added value of community. It will provide cubicles, individual offices, conference spaces and meeting spaces. 
