One of the best examples of this lack of understanding is the reduction in maintenance expenditur by many utilities in order to meet budget."

SAAMA's annual conference is again co-located with African Utility Week this year and is joined by the Global Forum on Maintenance and Asset Management (GFMAM). "The GFMAM participation adds a different dimension to the discussions have in South Africa and Africa. Many of the more advanced countries have gone through the same painful development curve that we are now experiencing in Africa and their experience is invaluable in enabling us to develop short cuts on the road to asset life-cycle cost optimisation," adds Booyzen.
